Description: Full-Time (40 hours a week)

Summary: Works primarily with the Education Director to develop, organize, coordinate, and provide environmental education programming for K-12 students and families within the St. Johns River watershed, as well as staffing tables at scheduled outreach events and festivals.

Responsibilities include:

- Educational Boat Trips and Hikes
 - Schedule and lead educational boat trips throughout the year, including RiverX trips for 4th-6th graders, and EcoCruises for families and homeschool students.
 - Plan and assist Education Director in leading 'EcoAdventures' series for families.
 - Record relevant information and attendance in our departmental metrics and send monthly updates to the Education Director.
 - Work with Education Director to plan, organize, and implement educational events, such as Bartram Frolic.
- In-classroom Programming
 - Organize, coordinate, and provide in-person and virtual environmental education programming for K-12th grade classes throughout the watershed.
 - Work with Education Director to develop new programs and curriculum where needed (in-classroom, online, summer camps, etc.).
 - Help adapt in-person lessons to virtual learning through online interactive lessons, educational videos, and worksheet development.
 - Evaluate and record teacher feedback submitted through post-program surveys and send monthly updates to Education Director.
- Outreach
 - Help to identify and reach out to potential partners and educators to raise awareness of our programming and foster relationships and partnerships.
 - Attend occasional evening and weekend festivals and educational events (Science Night, Jax Science Fest, etc.), including helping with setup, staffing, and breakdown of table and display.
 - Assist with St. Johns Riverkeeper public awareness and outreach initiatives, if needed.
